

Heartfelt thanks to our parents for supporting Book Week in School. Our little children get so much out of it as it promotes an awareness of Literacy, Reading and Books and helps encourage good reading habits and an overall love of learning! Parents, as always, support this by preparing children so well for Book Character Day and also by allowing children to purchase a story/ novel / non fiction book from the Book Fair. This year our Book Fair totalled £ 2348.27 of which we are allowed a percentage commission of this to buy more books for our little children...so thank you so much!

Thanks also to all staff for facilitating Book Week and ensuring that the teaching and learning is centred around this very important theme. We had a focus on book/ nursery rhyme/ fairytale characters; their costumes, speeches about them, art work depicting them, dramatizing them, reading activities and much more!

Special thanks also to Mrs Connolly (Language and Literacy Leader) for organising all events in school providing an amazing literary experience for our little pupils.

## Encouraging School Attendance!

We are delighted that we have no further challenges to our little children attending face to face teaching and learning in school like we suffered during Covid. To this end, we ask for parents support by encouraging school attendance every day. We understand that from time to time a child may be ill and if this happens please email the teacher or ring the school so that the correct absence code can be recorded for your child to explain the absence. Our school policy aims for at least 90% school attendance for every child. Help us to achieve this. To this end we will be giving out termly BREAKFAST CLUB VOUCHERS for any child who achieves 90% and more attendance. (Previously we gave for 100% but in order to support and encourage our children trying so hard we will give these vouchers now for any child who achieves between 90-100%). Thank you for your continued support!

**Fridays : Year 1A Pupils, Year 1 B Pupils and Learning Centre Pupils**





**Just some of the fabulous resource facilities in our School:** Our school is a split site campus with many benefits indeed, some of which are listed below;

1. A highly qualified and dedicated teaching and non-teaching staff team who work so hard to give the absolute best provision for all children in their care
2. Two FIVE STAR Canteens (one on each site) where fresh food is made in each one on a daily basis. They host a breakfast club also which is open from 8.15am until 8.50am each day. We serve HOT FOOD FULL BREAKFASTS on FRIDAYS also!
3. Two ICT Suites (one on each site) with a full range of state-of-the-art Hard drive Computers
4. Well-resourced classrooms with Ipads and Clever Touch Interactive Whiteboards in every class
5. Two SENSORY ROOMS (one on each site) to give an additional facility for children with sensory needs. We also have a NURSERY SENSORY Facility for our littlest learners.
6. NURTURE Facility for children who benefit from additional specialist nurture support
7. Two LEARNING SUPPORT Rooms (one on each site) so that specialist support can be given to children who need help with Literacy and Numeracy
8. NEW EDUCATION AUTHORITY SPECIALIST LEARNING CENTRE Provision (Junior School Site) (the only one in the locality) for children who experience Learning Needs and can avail of specialist support in a very small class setting as opposed to full larger mainstream classes. Children are referred into this class by Educational Psychologist.


### Hallowe'en Film Fun Day
