Launch of Reconstitution of School Boards of Governors

A reconstitution campaign has been launched by the Department of Education (DE) and the Education Authority, (EA) to encourage applications for the role of school governor.

Controlled schools' Boards of Governors (BoGs) are usually reconstituted every four years when members complete their term of office and may be reappointed or replaced. The aim of reconstitution is to achieve a good balance of individuals on the BoG, based on the skills, knowledge and experience that they bring to the role.

EA CEO Sara Long commented: "School governors play a vital role in the successful management of schools. Working together with school leaders, they set the vision, ethos and strategic direction of the school. They can bring experience from other walks of life and make an important contribution using qualities such as empathy and good judgement. Governors focus on making a genuine difference to the outcomes of children and young people in their schools."

EA is encouraging volunteers from all backgrounds, across NI, to apply for the role of school governor and previous experience, or formal qualifications are not required. Anyone aged 18 or over can volunteer to become a school governor. Successful applicants will be expected to take up the post for a four-year term of office from 2024 - 2028.

Addressing Bullying Behaviour – Parent and Pupil guide launched

Following collaboration with over 100 schools throughout the region, the EA Addressing Bullying in Schools Implementation Team (ABSIT) has developed resources for use with children and young people, and to share with parents/carers.

These resources are available on the <u>Addressing Bullying Behaviour page</u> on our website and provide information on:

- The legal definition of bullying type behaviour and the difference between this and other socially unacceptable behaviour.
- School support for children, young people, and their families in line with the Addressing Bullying in Schools Act (NI) 2016.
- Advice for parent, carers and pupils regarding how bullying type behaviour is identified and supported in schools.
- Signs that a pupil could be experiencing bullying type behaviour and signposting to further support.

Attending the 'AI in Education in NI' conference were two hundred school principals and senior teachers together with representatives from the Department of Education (DE), Education Authority (EA), Council for Curriculum, Examinations and Assessment (CCEA) and other education leaders.

Delegates heard from keynote speaker and international expert, Professor Mairead Pratschke, on the opportunities and challenges arising from the rapid development of AI in education.

This was followed by representatives from Google and Microsoft who presented the latest AI developments in their collaborative productivity workspaces.
